#### [ JOURNALIST: ]

Exactly one year ago, during the Quebec election, Lucien Bouchard pledged that sovereignists would be completely frank in the Referendum.

# [ LUCIEN BOUCHARD: ]

It would have to be CLEAR. Straightforward. "YES. We want to separate from the Rest of Canada." "We want to have our COUNTRY."

# [ JOURNALIST: ]

Today, the Sovereignists have changed their tune.

### [ JEAN-FRANÇOIS LISÉE: ]

The vote WILL NOT BE on SEPARATION – It will NOT BE on SEPARATION –

### [ JOURNALIST: ]

Why?

#### [ JEAN-FRANÇOIS LISÉE: ]

Because countries, in the world – You know, Quebec, uh – Canada and U.S. are not "separate countries". They're sovereign countries. They are countries. OK?

Separation is – you know, it's uh – I understand why the NO side is so – intent in using that word, it has a negative connotation – Uh – But no.

This is about – extending a hand – to your neighbour, saying: Listen, there are a number of things – some things that we agree on – and that are in each other's best interests – Let's TRY and do that –

But, we give you notice that – as for sovereignty, we will do it. So, this doesn't look, it doesn't sound to me as SEPARATION.
